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Dual Credit (College) Enrollment

Students may enroll jointly at SA and at an accredited college under the following conditions:

- Students at SA dually earn high school and college credits through Southampton Academy, and upon the teacher's classification as an adjunct professor. Contact our College Counseling office for information.
- All dual enrollment online courses on the student's SA schedule, including independent studies, must take place on SA's campus under the supervision of an SA staff member
- Students must continue taking a minimum of four classes on campus. Special exceptions may be provided by the Head of School.
- No college course may replace a graduation requirement currently offered at SA. Students may enroll in additional college courses other than what is offered at SA. These courses will not be included on the student's Southampton Academy transcript. Exceptions may be made at the discretion of the Head of School, but will count only as electives with no impact on the student's high school GPA.
- The student is responsible for having the college send a transcript or other verification of completed course requirements to SA for entry onto the student's high school transcript.
- Students who enroll in additional college courses, other than those offered as part of the SA curriculum, are responsible for all costs and fees.

Course Change Requests/ Withdrawals
